

Wedding Day Tips

- When you receive your wedding day agenda approximately four weeks before your wedding, please let us know as soon as possible if you would like to add any special shots to the list. Likewise, if there are any photographs that you think of on your wedding day, please let us know so we can include them.
- Be sure to walk in your wedding shoes for a few hours before your wedding day. The more comfortable your shoes are, the more relaxed you will feel.
- Designate someone to take care of any small problems and questions on your wedding day so that you will not be distracted and concerned with the small stuff. Don't be the wedding coordinator. It's your day, enjoy it, and allow yourself to be pampered!
- Give the wedding party and close family a copy of the photography agenda at the rehearsal. If everyone knows what time they are going to be photographed, it will be easier to get all the shots you want and to stay on schedule.
- When the groom and groomsmen pick up their tuxedos, have everyone try on their jackets. Sometimes they do not fit as expected, and it's better to check it where they can be tailored rather than at the wedding site or home when it's too late. The white cuff should show about an inch below the sleeve of the jacket. It's not a problem if they don't, but it just looks better.
- Try to discourage other photographers from photographing over our shoulders. If someone is photographing, don't worry or stress, just know that we might have to politely ask him or her to refrain from photographing. Often, other photographers hinder us from doing our job and providing the best pictures possible. We will be as discreet and nice as possible, but we are working for you.
- Be sure to ask the florist to bring the flowers to the ceremony site at least three hours prior to the wedding. This way the bouquets, corsages, boutonnieres and arrangements are ready and waiting for the pre-ceremony photography.
- For those having their wedding ceremony in a church, please ask to receive a copy of the photography guidelines. Every church has different rules, so it's always good to pass these on to us prior to your special day.
- Make sure you allow extra time for your hair and make-up; it may take longer than you originally thought. If it typically takes you 20 minutes to do your makeup, give yourself 40. Do the same with other aspects of getting ready. You'll be glad to have the extra time so your day is not rushed.
- Bring a small bag packed with all the "emergency" items you and your wedding party might need. Things such as a sewing kit, safety and bobby pins, scissors, an extra pair of panty hose and other items can really save the day.
- And last, but not least, please remember to relax and enjoy your special day!
